## London aviation firm to move local HQ to Lake Nona

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A London multinational aviation company plans to move its Orlando office to fast-growing Lake Nona, developer Tavistock Development Co. announced on Oct. 17.

BBA Aviation Plc — parent to <u>Signature Flight Support</u> in Orlando — signed a 65,000-square-foot lease to anchor the new six-story, Class A office building in the Lake Nona Town Center.

PCL Construction plans to break ground this fall on the building at the southwest corner of Veteran's Way and Lake Nona Boulevard this fall and it's expected to be completed in late 2018. BBA Aviation/Signature will seek bids for buildout of its space in March.

The BBA Aviation headquarters will be located in the newest office building in the growing Lake Nona Town Center at the intersection of Veteran's Way and Lake Nona Boulevard.

"We could not be more pleased to locate our new BBA Aviation/Signature Flight Support headquarters in the Lake Nona Town Center," said Maria Sastre, president and chief operating officer of Signature Flight Support, in a prepared statement. "This state-of-the-art business and residential community offers endless benefits for our employees and for the future of BBA Aviation/Signature Flight Support. We have designed a superior working environment for our team, where we will continue to drive our world-class business forward, and we very much look forward to becoming part of the Lake Nona community."

The building is the second office complex in the overall \$780 million, 3.8 million-square-foot, mixed-use Lake Nona Town Center that Tavistock is developing in partnership with Columbus, Ohio-based Steiner + Associates. The town center will feature 1.2 million square feet of shopping, dining, services and entertainment facilities, along with about 200 hotel rooms and structure parking.

The next \$300 million phase of the town center will bring a big entertainment element to the community, which already boasts 12,000 residents and 5,000 employees in the Medical City life sciences hub. Tenants are expected to include a brewery, bowling alley and medically integrated fitness center in partnership with the University of Central Florida, though none have been announced yet.

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
